FIRST RESIDENT MEETING ON SUSTAINABILITY

The first resident meeting on sustainability, which had quite a few attendees, took place on the evening of Wednesday, April 10. Afterwards, all attendees went home feeling both satisfied and well informed due to the advice offered by the "energy coaches" of Energiek Leiden as well as other residents.

The meeting was organized by the Sustainability focus group from the neighbourhood association in collaboration with Energiek Leiden. Promoting sustainability in de Maredijkbuurt is one of the aims in the neighbourhood plan, and the focus group wants to give support to residents and encourage them to start looking at ways of making their houses more sustainable.

Energiek Leiden was represented by four energy coaches. It is their duty to assist homeowners in the possible steps they can undertake, be it simple or very complex, to make their houses more sustainable. To start, it is key to gain insight into the current state of a house with respect to sustainability (such as energy usage) as well as the personal wishes of the homeowners. Based on this information, Energiek Leiden will guide residents to the first possible steps they can undertake.

Ester Nieuwhuis and Yolanda Hakemulder, who are both residents of the Maredijkbuurt, tried out the option to gain advice from Energiek Leiden, and



were present at the meeting to share their experiences. It became clear to them that filling in the details about their respective houses was no picnic. Still, even if you can't fill in everything, Energiek Leiden is able to give you a report that helps you get going by giving some suggestions and estimating the costs.

During the meeting, there were three tables where you could seek information and advice on different subjects, in great detail if so desired. The subjects were solar panels, insulation and quick wins.



The jigsaw contest was very exciting! The whistle was blown at 14.00 sharp. The contestants could choose between 500-piece jigsaws by Jan van Haasteren. After 1 our and 15 minutes of toiling, sweating and having quick looks at the other teams, the table of the Broerse family

shouted 'FINISHED'. A great accomplishment!

Based on the feedback we received at the end of the evening, the meeting proved to be very informative and helped gain more insight. It also became clear that some measures are much more complex than others, for example, those needed for older houses (built before 1930).

The focus group Sustainability is going to organise a new meeting on WEDNESDAY MAY 22 2024.
