

WHAT ARE VOORZORGCIRKELS AND WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?



Voorzorgcirkels (literally: "pre-care circles" or "precaution circles") are groups of 10 to 15 people who support each other in a variety of ways. They agree to be at each other's beck and call, and discuss how they can best help one another. They do this voluntarily, but with a great dedication.

The word 'care' should be understood to mean 'to look after each other'—it does not mean professional health care. *Voorzorgcirkels* are formed—as the word indicates—as a precaution. People help one another and, if necessary, take care of each other. It means giving help, but also asking it from others.

It doesn't concern medical care, which is what professionals are for. In a *voorzorgcirkel*, help comes in the form of, for example, going shopping, walking the dog, or even sewing a button. FALL PREVENTION: STAYING STEADY ON YOUR FEET!

Is it increasingly important for you to prevent falls? Do you have trouble walking, keeping balance or exercise? Then join the course *Leiden Blijft Staan*—intended for those aged 65 and up who want to increase their strength, balance and confidence.

Over the course of 13 weeks, you will work on exercising safely, both in and around the house, under the guidance of an expert coach. The classes are weekly, one hour long and will often conclude with a coffee break.

The Fall Prevention course by Incluzio and the Maredijkbuurt will begin on Friday September 5 in the Maredijkhuis, starting at 10 AM.

Summary

"I was born on April 13, 1944, in Posen, an old Polish city that for centuries had been called Poznań. But when I was born, during a bombardment that seemed to herald the end of time, Posen was a German city, a logistical junction from which Hitler had sent his Nazi troops into the Soviet Union in three waves of attack just one year before. It was a miserable adventure, and Posen paid dearly. ...

"My family was part of that drama. And that is what this book is about. It's about the consequences of the war. It's about a sly grandfather who became—in the most remarkable ways—one of the richest people in Latvia, but who, two days before the war broke out, was forced to leave everything behind and flee to the Netherlands with his Russian wife and four children. It's about a naive father who, out of idealism against the Soviets, went to the eastern front wearing the

uniform of the SS, only to be destroyed when he returned to the Netherlands. It's about a mother who, after getting divorced, fled to Germany and was no longer allowed to be my mother. And it's about me, the grandson, the son, and heir."

Alexander Münninghoff (Poznań, 1944) was a journalist and expert on Russia. He won the prize for newspaper journalism, and was the author of Tropical Years in Moscow (1991), about his time as a correspondent in the Soviet Union. *De Stamhouder* is autobiographical and based on facts and stories told in the family. From the running reporter



Maredijkbuurt Leiden – the children in de Maredijkbuurt have their very own reporter. For this edition we'll again be going through the neighbourhood, looking for the best spots. This week we're meeting with Nikkie and Huub.

"Do we look like each other?" asks Nikkie. She looks at me questioningly. If I hadn't known that Nikkie and Huub are sister and brother, I wouldn't have noticed right away. "You have the same color eyes. Just a different shape." When they were little, they looked very much alike, they tell me. Coincidentally, just before I arrived, they had found pictures of their mother when she was a lot younger. And it was just as if Nikkie was the one in the picture, she says. Huub agrees.

I notice that they get along very well. "Do you often play together?" I ask. "Yes," they both say. They have arguments sometimes, too, but they also really enjoy doing things with the two of them. They are about 2.5 years apart.

One of the places they like to play together — and with friends - is the pirate island. So we walk to the island. "We play tag," says Nikkie. "And we go over the bridge and then sometimes we walk on that path, there," Huub continues, pointing. "In the summer we also go and catch animals here and then we study them." "Yes," adds Nikkie. "We have a bin with all kinds of stuff and a magnifying glass." And so they look at the color and feelers and more things, and then they're going to figure out what they're called. "My dad has one of those apps. You can look up names of plants and insects with that." "Or we play hide-and-seek in the reeds. In the summer it is full of reeds here." Clearly, they are already looking forward to that.

There is one other thing they both really really enjoy when they are on the island. "The dogs! If there are dogs then we go and play with them." They both look genuinely happy. "Then we throw a ball, for example," Huub explains. Huub also immediately knows who his favorite dog is: Lotte. Nikkie thinks about her favorite dog. "She is red with brown and has little short legs." She doesn't remember the name. "I can't remember names very well." "Does the dog live in the house with the Lego on the windowsill? "I ask. "Yes!" "That's Saartje," I know, because my kids love her too. And who do I run into, when I've brought Huub and Nikkie back home and am walking home? Saartje! "You will be in the neighborhood newspaper," I tell her. With Nikkie and Huub.

THE NEIGHBORHOOD BEE

Every neighborhood in South Holland has had its own neighborhood bee since last year. And for our neighborhood, it is the ivy bee. It is 8.5 to 15 mm in size and has a brown-

haired chest. On the abdomen, you can see striking yellow hair bands. Together with other insects, it pollinates about 75% of all flowers, vegetables, and fruits. Without the bee, there would be no strawberries, apples, beans, or pumpkins. But as more nature disappears, the bees are not doing well. The ivy bee loves ivy, especially the flowers, but also autumn asters and reseda. Plant these in the garden, on the street, or on the balcony where it likes them, simple right?
